By the end of the play, it is clear how much they really mean to each other and have given to each other over the years. *Love Letters*, a unique and imaginative theatre piece, is evocative, touching, and funny.

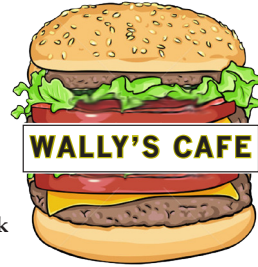
